DIVINE PROVIDENCE

The starting point of all theology is the existence and being of God. According to the first article of the Nicene Creed, the creed of our faith, "I believe in One God, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth and of all things, visible and invisible." Therefore, the world, composed of seen and unseen things, is the work and creation of God. "In the beginning God created the heaven and the earth."

From the study of biology, we know that in this world there are many great and powerful things which man has not yet discovered. Astronomers, geologists, physicists, and other scientists are working to discover these things, just as they discovered the electrons and atomic energy. Who placed these powers in Nature? Not man, of course, but some higher power. This power is God.

God created the world both visible and invisible in six days. How long was a day is unknown to us.

The reason and cause of the existence of the world lies in God Himself. The goodness of God gives us the reason of Creation. The Creation is the work of great wisdom and might, and proceeds forth from the hands of the All-wise and Almighty God. God Who is all good, wished to give existence to non-being, in accordance with the prototype existing in Him, in order that He might constitute other entities capable of sharing His goodness. The actualization and realization of this plan of God, which was eternally in His mind, was effected by the Creation of the world in time. So the Creation has God as its cause. It was His free-act, and He created it from nothing. Such theories teaching that God created the world out of necessity, or from pre-existent matter, are entirely opposed to the Orthodox Christian belief and doctrine. The Creation of the world, both as to its substance as well as to its form, is a mystery of the Christian faith. God has only revealed to us what is of most importance for our needs, and what is sufficient for our Salvation.

Closely now connected, in our Orthodox theology, with the existence of God and the doctrine of Creation, is that concerning His Divine Providence. Since the world was a result and consequence of God's overflowing goodness and bounty, it is impossible that He should have abandoned it after having brought it into being. God never ceases in His caring for the world which He so beautifully created. He always cares for the world and for the people in it. We have many examples which show that God cares for all of His creations. For example, the Universe, which God made with the Sun and stars and all the laws and powers of

Nature, continues to exist without ever losing its harmony with which God made it.

From the Sermon on the Mount, found in the Gospel of Saint Matthew (chapter 5-7), God's Providence is shown to us in two ways – first in His oversight and preservation of His Creation, and secondly, in His governance and direction of His Creation. God preserves and governs the world (physical and spiritual) through the powers which He bestowed in the Universe.

God rules the whole of His universe, sustains it in being and oversees it in whole and in part. It is extended to each and everything in the world, and especially to man who is the center of the creation and the peculiar care and concern of God's oversight and preservation.

The earth brings forth grass and trees and fruit from which both man and animal finds nourishment. All this occurs without interruption under the watchful eye of God. After the winter comes the spring. Then comes summer and fall. After the storm comes peace and calm. God gives new inspiration to men to find new medicines, new chemical formulas for man to live better and longer and in order to thank God.

For all of us, everyone, God is a true Father, and as a Father we should ask Him for all things in life that are necessary. God loves and cares for man so much that even after the fall of Adam and Eve, He did not leave man to suffer spiritually but sent His Only Begotten Son, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ to save the world from sin and death. Neither Angels nor Prophets nor men could save the world. Only God did.

God's Providence extends to everything in His Creation, yet saves man's free will. The acts of man are not predetermined for God knows man's acts to be free and His knowledge does not affect them. Moral evil, that is, evil depending on man's will, is an inherent possibility, and results in physical evil. The denial of God's oversight and guidance of His world issues in the denial of all religion and morality and in a loss of faith in prayer. So God exists!! He gives the sun which warms the earth. God protects and loves the whole universe. God exists!! Every morning He sends us a new day. God grants us life. God gives us everything.

A primary goal of Stewardship is to promote spiritual growth and strengthen faith. Becoming a Steward begins when we believe in God, to whom we give our love, loyalty and trust and act on those beliefs. As Stewards, we affirm that every aspect of our lives comes as a gift from Him. Stewardship calls on the faithful to cheerfully offer back to God a portion of the gifts with which they have been blessed.

An Orthodox Christian Steward is an active participant in the life of the Church. The parish encourages all who accept the Orthodox Faith to become practicing Stewards. Each year the Steward is expected to carefully review his or her personal circumstances and make a commitment of time, talent, and treasure to support the Parish and her Ministries.

In Oriented Leadership their book on Orthodox Christian leadership, Williams and McKibben define stewardship as the call of the faithful to share willingly the gifts that God has bestowed on them, including sharing these gifts for God's work. Stewardship is devotion and service to God and His Church as persons, as families, as a Parish, and as the Church Universal. Stewardship is our active commitment to use ALL our time, talent and treasure for the benefit of humankind in grateful acknowledgement of Christ's redeeming love.

What is Orthodox Christian Stewardship? Orthodox Christian Stewardship is caring for the needs of others, it is offering one's self to God as He offered Himself to us, and it is what a person does after saying "I believe..." as proof of that belief.

Don't forget to turn your clocks back one hour at 2:00 a.m. on Sunday, November 1, 2015 millions of groggy Americans will turn their clocks back one hour, ending Daylight Saving Time. A safety reminder: Many fire departments encourage people to change the batteries in their smoke detectors when they change their clocks because Daylight Saving Time provides a convenient reminder. "A working smoke detector more than doubles a person's chances of surviving a home fire," says William McNabb of the Troy Fire Department in Troy, Michigan. More than 90 percent of homes in the United States have smoke detectors, but one-third are estimated to have either dead or missing batteries.

TEACHING DIVINE LITURGY:

Sunday, November 29, 2015

Prayer is a form of communion between God and humanity. It is a conversation, a *dialogue* between us and our Creator. We reveal our inner-most secrets, requests, needs, and problems to God, and God reveals His Will to our mind. We acknowledge our faults and shortcomings with assurance that He is a merciful God. In return, we experience the satisfaction of forgiveness. At times, our prayers are words of gratitude and glorification to God for His kindness to us. Regardless of what *type* of prayer we offer, when it pertains to us *personally*, it is a private prayer.

Public prayer, or worship, is offered by our Church through attendance at the Divine Liturgy. Participation in the Liturgy means being part of the re-enactment of the *birth*, *life*, *death*, *resurrection*, *and ascension of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ*, together with common prayer, the study of the scriptures, and communion with God.

The **Divine Liturgy is a Sacrament of the Church**. It is a sacred, mystical action between God and His people. It originated with the Last Supper; and the Apostles, obedient to the Lord's command of, "Do this in remembrance of Me," observed it regularly. St. Paul also gives us a description of the Divine Liturgy in his First Epistle to the Corinthians. Before the Gospels were written, Sacred Tradition provided the basis, the authority, and the method for the observance. Words and phrases were gradually added to the Divine Liturgy. Since the beginning of the Fourth Century, however, when St. Basil compiled the present form of the Divine Liturgy, we have had no substantial changes or variations. Thus, throughout the centuries, the Divine Liturgy has preserved its four major features.

First, the Divine Liturgy is a *remembrance* of the life, cross, death, resurrection, and ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Secondly, the Divine Liturgy is a *sacrifice*. "This is my body which is broken for you," said Christ, and "This is my blood which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins." Unlike the *primitive* forms of sacrifice, *this sacrifice* is the *perfect sacrifice* offered by the only begotten Son of God.

Thirdly, the Divine Liturgy is a *communion*. "Take, eat, this is my body," and "drink of it all of you, this is my blood," said Christ. When we approach the Holy Cup we receive *Christ* in our hearts; rather, we should say that *we* are received by Christ!! We receive forgiveness of our sins and we reconcile ourselves with God.

Finally, the Divine Liturgy is a **thanksgiving**, because Christ offered a thanksgiving to God the Father before He instituted the Sacrament. Thus, whenever we receive Holy

Communion, we gratefully recall the *love* of Jesus Christ, who died for us.

On **Sunday, November 29, 2015**, we shall partake in a very special Divine Liturgy. Father will offer a teaching Divine Liturgy. A commentary, explaining what is about to take place, will precede each of the five major parts of the Divine Liturgy. The Divine Liturgy will be celebrated on the solea with Father facing the congregation. This will give the congregation an opportunity to see as well as hear what we do during the Divine Liturgy. This commentary will begin right before the singing of the Doxology, which is at the close of the Orthros Service. Please try and be on time in order that you may benefit from the whole experience.




