#### GOD IS THE SOWER OF THE SEED

In His love for humanity the Lord Jesus travelled on foot from village to village and from city to city to preach the Good News of the Kingdom of God, the Kingdom of which He was both the herald and the content. On the one hand there were those who responded positively to Him and His message, so that it made a positive difference in their lives and in their relationship with God.

On the other hand, there were those who responded negatively. They did not bother to listen to Him, or they quickly forgot what they had heard. They may have been enthusiastic initially, but only until they were confronted with temptations and trials of Christian living, of following Jesus Christ. For example, when they were confronted with the danger of being banned from the synagogue for being a follower of the Lord Jesus and His teaching, they chose to deny the Lord instead. The Apostles would later have this same experience.

And even today it is no different. In some people's lives we see the Gospel take root and produce a tremendous harvest of love for God, for our fellow humans, and for all of creation; a harvest of growth in grace, love, peace and joy. But for others, sad to say, this harvest does not happen. The Lord therefore tells the parable of the Sower of the Seed to explain why the preaching of the Gospel has such mixed results, in this world. To this day, there appears to be an awful lot of wasted effort, with only a minority responding with complete and total enthusiasm. The parable of the Sower of the Seed is read in the Gospel of Luke, chapter 8, verses 5 through 15. This Gospel lesson will be read on Sunday, October 16 this year.

It all seems to depend on the state of one's soul, whether the Word of the Gospel will take root and produce a beautiful harvest or not. So it is not necessarily the preacher who is at fault, unless, of course, they failed to prepare adequately, or spoke carelessly or in the wrong spirit, perhaps of condemnation, instead of love.

But assuming that it is Christ who ultimately speaks the word of the Gospel to our hearts, we would do well to examine our hearts, and to ask whether we obey the Biblical Command found in Deuteronomy 6:4-5: "Hear O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength."

In the parable of the Sower, the seed of the Word that fell by the wayside and was snatched away by the birds, i.e. by the devil, is the Word preached to the unworthy heart, the heart of the person who failed to love God with all their heart. Such a heart was never ready or receptive to the word of God.

The seed that fell on the rocky ground is the Word that was preached to a shallow soul, a soul unprepared for the trials and temptations that is part and of the organic reality of the reception of the Gospel. Such a person fails to love God with all their soul.

The seed sown among thorns is the Word preached to the worldly, who are concerned with the power and status that comes from wealth and material goods. These people fail to love God with all their strength. Instead, they invest almost all their energy to acquire more earthly wealth.

Should we read Psalm 1, we will find the person who fulfils all the commands of the "Hear o Israel!" statement. This person loves God with all their heart and all their soul, and all their strength. And so, when the Word is sown in their heart it "brings forth its fruit in its season", since a good heart will "keep it and bear fruit with patience". This person experiences the joy and peace and love of the Kingdom of heaven, even while on earth.

The parable of the Lord helps us not only to understand why the preaching of the Gospel meets with such mixed results in this world, and in our own lives. We are challenged to examine our own hearts and to ask whether we love God with all our heart, and all our soul, and all our strength. And whether we are truly open and receptive to the life-giving Word of Christ, eager and willing to do whatever it takes to produce a harvest pleasant to God; "careful to maintain good works".

# MASSIVE DAMAGE AT IONIAN VILLAGE, ARCHDIOCESE BEGINS REBUILDING CAMPAIGN

NEW YORK — Following the initial news of destruction at the Ionian Village Camp facilities, the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America announces today with sadness, that in the early morning of Thursday, September 8th, the campus of the Ionian Village Camping Program in Vartholomio, Greece, sustained massive damage from fierce tornadoes that hit the area in and around the camp.

The summer programs of Ionian Village had concluded earlier in August and thankfully there were no campers or staff present. All the local staff that works at the camp, including the Nastoulis family, is safe and accounted for.

The devastation at the camp is extensive, as is evident from the pictures on the Archdiocese website. The physical buildings and facilities of the campus have suffered substantial damage, and hundreds of trees have been either toppled or completely uprooted. While the Chapel of Saint Iakovos sustained only minor exterior damage, the area known as "The Pines," the home to the unique Ionian Village Orthodox Life program, has been mostly destroyed. Extensive damage was also incurred at other major areas including the pool, the camper cabins, the cafeteria, the arts & crafts area, and the area behind the camp where the camp animals lived. The Archdiocese is currently working with both construction professionals and engineers to not only assess the visible damage but also to further investigate any structural damage that may have occurred.

In response to the outpouring of support and offers of assistance from many campers, parents and faithful stewards of Ionian Village, the Archdiocese had initiated a fundraising campaign to assist in the rebuilding efforts. All funds donated to this campaign will go directly to the immediate clearing, repair and rebuilding of the Ionian Village campsite.

Your donation to the rebuilding efforts at Ionian Village is an investment in one of the most successful and vital ministries of our Archdiocese and will ensure that the next generation of campers will experience the life-transforming work that has been done at this Christ centered ministry for over 46 years.



#### CALLED TO BE SAINTS . . .

#### THE HOLY GREAT MARTYR DEMETRIOS THE MYRRH-STREAMER - OCTOBER 26



Saint Demetrios was a Thessalonian, a most pious son of pious and noble parents, and a teacher of the Faith of Christ, When Maximian first came to Thessalonica in 290. he raised the Saint to the rank of Duke of Thessaly. But when it was discovered that the Saint was a Christian, he was arrested and kept bound in a bath-house. While the games were under way in the city, Maximian was a spectator there. A certain friend of his, a barbarian who was a notable wrestler, Lyaeus by name, waxing haughty because of the height and strength of his body, boasted in the stadium and challenged the citizens to a contest with him. All that fought with him were defeated. Seeing this, a certain youth named Nestor, an acquaintance of Demetrios', came to the Saint in the bath-house and asked his blessing to fight Lyaeus single-handed. Receiving this blessing and sealing himself with the sign of the precious Cross, he presented himself in the stadium, and said, "O God of Demetrios, help me!" and straightway he engaged Lyaeus in combat and smote him with a mortal blow to the heart, leaving the former boaster lifeless upon the earth. Maximian was sorely grieved over this, and when he learned who was the cause of this defeat, he commanded straightway and Demetrios was pierced with lances while he was yet in the bath-house. As for Nestor, Maximian commanded that he be slain with his own sword.

Each year, on the first Sunday in October (on or after the Feast of St. Romanos the Melodist, the patron saint of church musicians), parishes across the Archdiocese of America celebrate NATIONAL CHURCH MUSIC SUNDAY. This commemoration was inaugurated by His Eminence, Archbishop Iakovos of North and South America in 1982, and has been re-affirmed by His Eminence, Archbishop Demetrios of America.

NATIONAL CHURCH MUSIC SUNDAY is a day we set aside particularly to honor the contributions of local choir members, psaltai, and music educators who serve their churches through the hymnology of our Orthodox Church. In addition, it is a day when we recognize the work of the diocesan choir federations as well as the National Forum of Greek Orthodox Church Musicians, who through their music ministry, strive to enhance the development of church choirs, church musicians, and liturgical music at diocesan and archdiocesan levels.

We take this opportunity to publicly thank our chanters and our choir director, organist and choir members for their love of Christ and for their dedicated service to our beloved Saint George Cathedral.

#### October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month

#### **How to Defend Yourself Against Breast Cancer**

Early detection is so far the best defense against breast cancer. The reason is not farfetched as early detection enhances timely treatment of infection. This can be done through regular breast examination. These days, much information is found in a variety of publications on breast self examination. Women are advised to make use of information from their health care professionals. This notwithstanding, the following guidelines are in agreement with the American Cancer Society's recommendations.

By getting a mammogram done annually if you are over 40 years of age.

Through proper annual clinical breast examination (CBE) by a health care professional if you are over 40 years of age – preferably around the time that you receive your mammogram.

By having a CBE done once every three years if you are 20 to 39 years of age.

Conducting monthly breast self-exam if you are over 20 years of age.

Reducing cigarette intake – according to research statistics, nearly 50% of women are sensitive to the carcinogens in tobacco, which implies more risks of developing breast cancer.

Increasing the amount of fresh fruits and vegetables intake. This is because they contain antioxidant vitamins and other nutrients that can help in cancer prevention.

Eating foods high in phytoestrogen, a chemical found in soy products, flaxseed, and whole grains.

Reducing alcohol intake. High alcohol intake has been statistically linked to an increase in the risk of breast cancer.

By exercising regularly and maintaining normal body weight. These two factors help in breast cancer prevention.

## Fire Prevention tips on how to keep homes and families safe

Fire Prevention Week is October 9 through October 15, 2016 and many local fire agencies across the country want to remind people about what they can do to keep their homes and their families safe.

A big emphasis for this year's **Fire Prevention Week** is having properly working smoke alarms. Many fire departments are using the week to remind people that now is a good time to check smoke alarms and electrical cords, remember to keep matches and lighters away from children, and go over a family fire safety plan. The fire departments recommend checking your smoke alarm at least once a month to ensure that the batteries are working.

#### **Smoke Alarm Tips**

- -Test smoke alarms at least once a month using the test button, and make sure everyone in your home knows their sound.
- If an alarm "chirps," warning the battery is low, replace the battery right away.
- Replace all smoke alarms, including alarms that use 10-year batteries and hard-wired alarms, if they do not respond properly when tested.
- Never remove or disable a smoke alarm.

#### Winter Month Reminders

- Space heaters should be kept at least three feet away from anything that can burn.
- Chimneys and home heating systems should be cleaned or inspected once a year.
- Carbon monoxide alarms are also recommended for homes in addition to smoke detectors.


